	<u>THE AFRICANS (SERIES)</u> – 60 min. ea. c1986
V1199.1	THE NATURE OF A CONTINENT: <i>Geography influence on history which explores the roles that water, desert, and equatorial climate have played in developing African culture and civilization.</i>
V1199.2	A LEGACY OF LIFESTYLES: <i>What constitutes “family” in African culture? Matrilineal, patrilineal, and polygamous traditions as well as the impact of modern cities on family ties are examined.</i>
V1199.3	NEW GODS: <i>The roles of Christian missionaries, Western Secularism, Muslim sects, Egyptian pharaohs and native religions are discussed in visits to Senegal, Zaire, and Egypt.</i>
V1199.4	TOOLS OF EXPLOITATION: <i>Colonial, economic legacy, the development of slavery, and European control of Africa’s natural resources, with special attention to the roles of Belgium and Great Britain are examined.</i>
V1199.5	NEW CONFLICTS: <i>Urbanization, warrior traditions, European-created national boundaries, the Islamic jihad tradition, and nationalistic movements are problems of Africa’s post-colonial period.</i>
V1199.6	IN SEARCH OF STABILITY: <i>In a continent where 70+ coups have taken place in the last 25 years, the question of governing effectively is critical. This segment compares African military regimes, one party states, Marxism in Mozambique, and the styles of the presidents of Tanzania, and Zaire.</i>
V1199.7	A GARDEN OF EDEN IN DECAY? <i>More than 70 million Africans suffer from malnutrition while their countries export food to Europe. Economic and agricultural failures and successes are examined in Algeria, Ghana, and Zimbabwe.</i>
V1199.8	A CLASH OF CULTURES: <i>In every area of life – dress, behavior, law, worship and language-Africans have a triple heritage that often sends conflicting signals. The African struggle to evolve new, effective and essentially African ways of doing things is the topic of this episode.</i>
V1199.9	GLOBAL AFRICA: <i>Africa’s role in international politics and economics, from UN participation, to cobalt production and the political crisis of South Africa is the focus of this concluding episode.</i>

PROGRAM 1: DIFFERENT BUT EQUAL

The origins of Africa's past and her contributions that gave rise to some of the world's greatest early civilizations are explored in this segment.

PROGRAM 2: MASTERING A CONTINENT

Looking at three different communities, Basil Davidson examines the way African peoples carve out an existence in an often-hostile environment.

PROGRAM 3: CARAVANS OF GOLD

The routes of the medieval gold trade, which reached from Africa to India and China in the East, and westward to the city-states of Italy are explored.

PROGRAM 4: THE KINGS AND THE CITY

To explore the ways in which the African kingdoms functioned, Davidson visits Kano in Nigeria, where a king still holds court in his 15th century palace presiding with his council over ancient rituals which continue to command the respect of the people.

PROGRAM 5: THE BIBLE AND THE GUN

The slave trade of Africa decimated the population and rent apart the fabric of society. After the slaver traders came new kinds of interlopers: first, the explorers, among them Stanley & Livingstone; then the missionaries. Next came those interested in wealth-gold and diamonds.

PROGRAM 6: THIS MAGNIFICENT AFRICAN CAKE

The 1880's saw the beginning of a 30 year scramble for Africa which dramatically changed the face of the continent. All of Africa, except Liberia and Ethiopia became subject to colonial rule, a condition unchanged until the outbreak of WWII.

The major struggles for African independence in Ghana, Kenya, the Belgian Congo are charted. The final collapse of the white minority in Zimbabwe and a look at South Africa prior to its end of apartheid.

THE FIRST FREE ELECTION: *Chronicles the events following the collapse of the South African economy in the late 1980's when President F.W. DeKlerk ordered the release of Nelson Mandela from prison. Also traces the four-year period that led to South Africa's first multi-racial election and Mandela's stunning victory - 30 min, c1994*
- V1922.2** **DEFIANCE IN THE TOWNSHIPS:** *Traces the history of race relations in South Africa, from the landing of the Dutch settlers in 1652, to the establishment of the first white Afrikaner governments, to the protests against apartheid led by Nelson Mandela and the ANC- 34 min, c1994*
- V2011** **BLACK ATHENA**
Reviews evidence that the culture of ancient Greece had its origins in Africa and the East and that the West should recognize what it owes to Black and eastern cultures.- 52 min, c1991

The spectacular ruins of the Great Zimbabwe are only now being recognized for what they are: southern Africa's first city. This program looks at work being done to restore this archeological site to its African heritage. - 22 min, c1993
